SHOT WITH STONER BULLET

The predecessor to the Stoner Rifle, the Army M16, has permanently disabled a July riot victim here. IBM trainee and air force vetern Fred Brown was shot in the leg on July 25 by national guard troops from a half block away. Appariently Brown was shot because he was on the street after curfew.

According to witnesses, the guard fired seveal shots at Brown The one bullet whi h hit him, struch him on the left leg just ablove the ankle. The bullet, the deadly spinning .223 calibre, nearly tore the leg completely off.

Brown was held prisoner for nearly a month in Ford Hospital, even though no harges have ever been filed against him.

Inkster Must Glose Schools

Editor's note:

In these times of unprecedented properity, in the nation and the state, it is unthinkable that a school district would reach the c lose down. Just the other day we heard L.B.J. state that this nation was enjoying a period of unequalled prosperity and just last summer te Michigan legislature passed a bill authorizing a state income tax to provide additional monies for these statesmen. We wonder what has happened to the new revenues as well as the old, that such a situation could exist. Must be the State Income Tax was to pay politicians salary.

In a memorandum dated Dec. 15 1967 and given to all certified and Non-certified personnel in the Inkster Public Schools, Dr. Edward B. Fort, newly appointed negro Supt. of Schools declared, "That as of February 2, 1968, the Inkster Pub-lic School would no longer have funds to operate on and would therefore have to close down all educational operations above Kindergarten level. It is perhaps mandatory that I review for you, briefly, the pre-sent financial condition of this District as pertains to the matter of its projected economic solvency, point of insolvency and having to or lack thereof. On November 14, 1967, the Inkster Board of Education, adopted a Resolution giving the Superintendent of Schools the authority to initiate whatever action was necessary to secure authorization from the State Department of Education for purposes of borrowing --- if such was possible in the commercial market ---\$900,000 so as to enable us to omplete the school year 1967-1968. We were informed by the State

Department officials present. . . that currently existing state statutes will not allow this District, in act, to secure the needed authorization to borrow any money in the foreseeable future in anticipation of state aid for 1968-1969, i.e., not until May of 1968.

However, with respect to this meeting, in accordance with Section 388.836, Subsection 26 of the Michigan School Code, as related to the borrowing power of the local school district: "Not more than 15% of a school district's share of the appropriation for the next succeeding fiscal year shall be borrowed prior to the beginning of that fiscal year."

Ask anyone on Capfield between Russell and Riopelle about the CANFIELD COMMUNITY CEN-TER, and they will speak in warm and enthusiastic terms about the Walkers.

DODGE REBELS GAINS

Mon., Dec. 11 -- An agreement between Dodge Local 3, UAW, and the management o Hamtramck Assembly was reached before the midnight deadline last night. It still has to be rati-ied by the membership. The agreement contains gains for workers on additional help. All Chrysler plants generally are getting some additional utility men to aid on such things as bad mix on the production lines. At Dodge Main the agreement is reported to have gained three utility men in the Body Shop, two in the Paint Shop, nine in Final Assembly and 16 in the Trim Shop. It should be noted that though the Trim Shop and Final Assembly have about the same number working on the production lines, Trim seven more utility men than Final Assembly. This is not to say that Final Assembly needs them less. Rather, between a rank-and-file in the Trim Shop which was shown itself ready to fight and an in-plant leadership which is willing to back up their people, the workers got real gains.

Not only did the Trim Shop get more additional utility men negotiated into the settlement, but also the workers and the Trim Shop chief stewards and committee woman ought the company to a standstill on speed-up. The wildcat our weeks ago was caused by an inhuman speed-up drive in the Trim Shop. Before the national agreement had even been voted on, the Company arrogantly began speed-up the line from 56 to 62 ars an hour, an additional six cars. This was happening without any change in the work elements and without additional manpower. Not only that but the mix on the line was changed or the worse. Originally the run was 28 Chargers and 28 Baracudas; it, was to be hanged to 42 Chargers and 20 Baracudas.

Though the Company still has inreased production on the line in the Trim Shop, the combined ac-tion and pressure of the Trim workers and unit leaders forced the Company to almost double manpower on the line. The workers have come out ahead because of their willingness to fight in a united fashion. They have forced the Local leadership and the Company to put these gains into the Local agreement. However, a number of stewards and committeemen are holding back on calling for ratification of the agreement until a number of piled up work-standards grievances reaching back up to four months are resolved. The skilled trades committeeman wouldn't support the agreement because no protection was established against outside Contracting.

Texas Southern Five

On March 4, five black students from Texas Southern University will face trial and the death penalty on a frame-up charge of murder ing a white policeman. The arrests ollowed a police riot May 16 at the TSU campus which included shelling the dormitories with mortar shells and machine-gun fire, forcing the matron of the girls' dorm to lie down on the floor while cops shot looks off the doors of the girls' rooms, ransacked them, dragged the students out o their beds, beating them and forcing them into the street in their bedclothes.

Earlier the same day, police had arrested 43 demonstrators at Norwood Junior High School and 172 at a city garbage dump. The protest at the site of the dump was to demand that the city close it down because it was located in the heart of the black community and children often fell in and drowned. TSU militants supported this demonstration and the Junior High School protest against unjustified expulsions and beatings of black students by teachers and older white youth.

As a result of these arrests, police sentiment was that there would be a riot. The police went to the Texas Southern campus later that evening and arrested Douglas Wayne Wallace because they knew him to be a militant, A crowd of about 200 students gathered to find out why he had been arrested and soon dispersed. The police left the campus and returned in about two hours and fired on the dormitories. Students tried to fight back with bricks and whatever they could get their hands on. At this time Police Chief Herman Short was given the go ahead by Mayor Welch to "clean up the mess". The entire Houston police force, numbering about 650, advanced on the campus and shelled the entire dormitory area with mortar and machine-gun fire. An announcement came over the police radio that they were shooting at their own men. Students were brutally beaten, including some white students who were called "nigger lovers". Some bullets riocheted off the building.

The death of the policeman, Kuba, for which the Texas Southern Five are being framed to set an example against militant struggle, took place at this time. There were no windows on the side of the building from which the police attacked, therefore, a student's bullet would have had to make two right angle turns to hit a policeman. The accused are: Douglas Wallace, who was already in jail; Floyd Nichols and Charles Freeman, who were on the other side of the city; Trazewell Franklin and John Parker, who were in bed when the poli e attacked the dorms.

The widest publicity and protest that can be devoted to this ase are necessary to make possible the freedom of the TSU Five.

United States for Colonialism

The United States winces at accusations of being colonialist or neo-colonialist. Perhaps some light was shed on the question recently by two votes taken at the United Nations.

On November 17, the U.N. General Assembly condemned Portuguese colonialism in Africa. The resolution was passed by a vote of 82 to 7. The United States was one of the 7 voting against it.

Three weeks later, the General Assembly passed, 92 to 2, a resolution recommended by the Colonialism Committee, strongly condemning "the exploitation of colonial territories" by "foreign financial, economic and other interests." The U.S. was among 17 abstainers; protesting that the resolution was a propaganda exercise and would discourage private investment. Portugal and South Africa voted against it.

Wallace had been invited to appear here on December 9, 1967, but, due to heavy pressure and threats of a demonstration the engagement was cancelled. Many local militant and moderate groups are vigorously opposed to an appearance by this obvious racist in Detroit and it is likely that the same kind of opposition and pressure will mount this time. Indeed, he might provide the city with the first sparks since July.

COPS ASSAULT BLACK PANTHER LEADER MINISTER KILLS COP IN SELF-DEFENSE

fense of the Black Panther Party in Oakland, was shot while defending himself against two cops last month. One of the cops is dead and the other was hit with three bullet wounds as their attempt to silence another Black man backfired.

Newton is now a prisoner in the hospital of San Quentin where he is the victim of further brutality. Police have chained him to the bed at gunpoint. He was held incognito for a week - his family was not perto obtain court injunctions for entrance. He has been charged with the murder of the first cop and the shooting of the second.

On the day of the confrontation, Newton was stopped in his car by the two men. When he refused to get out of the car they attempted to force him to get out. Since he was within the law in remaining in the car, Huey resisted. At this

point both policemen arew men guns. The Minister of Defense responded to protect himself after the cops started to kill him. This incident took place in the heart of the Black community.

"We fully support Huey P. Newton in his leadership of the resistance against these brutally op-

APOLOGIZES TO HUEY

(Dr. Mary Jane Aguilar, 43 year my medical colleagues. To me, old, white Oakland-born physician, upon whose mind's eye it is persurgeon and research specialist at Pacific Medical Center in San Francisco, reports on her feelings at seeing the picture in the Palo Alto Times of Huey Newton strip-ped and handcuffed to the hospital

I can remember nothing in my medical training which suggested that, in the care of an acute abdominal injury, severe pain and hemmorrhage are best treated by manacling the patient to the ex-amining table in such a way that the back is arched and the belly tensed. Yet this is precisely the picture of current emergency room procedure which appeared on the front page of a local newspaper last weekend. Looming large in the foreground of the same picture, so large as to suggest a caricature, was a police officer. Could it have been he who instructed the doctor in charge of the case to position the patient in this curious way?

Unusual as it was, this picture probably did not disrupt very much the pleasant weekend enjoyed by my neighbors nor disturb more than momentarily the conscience of

manently engraved this photograph is a portentous document of modern history.

I apologize, Mr. Newton, for any aggravation of suffering inflicted upon you during the course of treatment of your injuries. I apologize for the subhuman conditions and horrors of the ghetto in which we force you to exist. I apologize for living too quietly within an immoral political and social system, a system which makes it inevitable that men like you are gunned down in the streets of our town.

PEACE And FREEDOM

AND THE **BLACK PANTHERS**

It is expected to boost Peace and Freedom registration in California ghettos, beginning in Oakland where this state's Panther group was founded.

At the Wednesday PFP session, white activists adopted a proposal to give strong support to a "Fair Trial for Huey Newton' policy. Huey Newton, the Black Panther Party's Minister of Defense, is charged with killing an Oakland policeman.

The Black Panther's cooperation with the Peace and Freedom Party is based on the PFP stand on Newton's trial, according to the Panther's Minister of Informa-

A coalition-based leaflet issued by the Peace and Freedom Party states "we all know that a white cop's word counts for more in white courts than any amount of impartial evidence from black people. Huey is entitled to a fair and impartial trial, but a trial free from prejudice under these circumstances is impossible. In fact, the white Establishment press has already convicted him.'

The Black Panthers' Minister of Information told BARB:

"They (Peace and Freedom) have gone on record publicly calling for a fair trial for Huey Newton and crying out against the climate of hysteria and lynch in Oakland."

"They have shown willingness to confront openly and publicly issues that are very important to the Black community."

BARB asked the Minister of Information whether the Panthers advocate that Blacks should aid the Peace and Freedom Party in its voter-registration drive. "A lot of people in the Black

community are not interested in 'electoral politics," he said. "Of those who are, many are opposed to the Democratic and the Republican Party, both of which have proven themselves to be open enemies of Black people in their struggle for national liberation.

"We view that segment of the political spectrum that comprises generally the radical and the left as a source of potential coalitions on specific issues," the Information Minister continued.

"We are joining with them because they are helping us on this issue. We feel that we have nothing to lose by supporting an element that supports a fair trial for Huey

"The fundamental principle we are working with is Stokely Car-michael's dictum of specific coalitions for specific purposes. We feel that this fits neatly into that framework."

The survival of the Bay Area's Black Panther organization is considered linked to Newton's fate.

The duty of a revolutionary is to make the revolution.

That is true, but there are two ambiguous words in the sentence. Revolution and revolutionary.

What is a revolutionary?

A revolutionary is one who makes revolution.

But if that is his duty, can he be defined by it? A corporal in the army is more than a corporal in the army. He can be a husband, father, lover, good guy, and a cold-blooded killer. A man is more than the sum of his functions.

Therefore, while it is the revolutionary's duty to make revolution, a revolutionary is more than one who makes revolution.

Before one can make revolution, one must have been revolutionized. The most human people in America are those who have seen the poison in this country and have set themselves against it. Blacks who yell, "Honkie!" are revolutionizing themselves. Whites who yell, "L.B.J.I L.B.J.! How many kids did you kill today?" are revolutionizing themselves. (Whether these acts will climax in the creation of revolutionaries remains to be seen.)

We must not think of revolution as fighting at the barricades, as hundreds of thousands marching down the streets waving huge flags, as going to the hills with a small band of armed guerrillas, as hiding arms under the floor boards of our bedrooms, as Che Guevarra's cigar, as so many romantic images, which aren't' romantic when you have to live them. They're difficult and dangerous and people die in revolutions, like those one million Algerians who died in the war against the French, like the Vietnamese for the past twenty years, like the 45 on the streets of Detroit.

But risking of life, this dying,

is not the revolution.

It is the natural result of the revolution thattakes place inside people when they stand up and shout "NO!" when they stand up and say, "ENOUGH!"



GI'S Become Killer Cops

Secretary of Defense McNamara directed the Armed Forces tohelp step up recruitment for the war

The incentive program to add 15,000 police to departments in major cities all over the country (many of which were rocked by Black uprisings last summer), came close on the heels of an inflammatory, racist speech by President Johnson in Washington on Nov. 3 when he said "The time has come in my judgment, when the American people are going to rise up and revolt against the law-

breaker in this country."

Apparently, however, the "A-merican people" haven't picked up their guns to shoot down the rebellious Black people fast enough for the liking, or safety, of the ruling class. So they are hi-ring more killer cops to do the job. According to a New York Times

report of Nov. 22, McNamara told the service secretaries that "early discharges, up to 90 days from the originally scheduled date of separation, were to be granted to military personnel 'who have written offers of specific law enforcement employment or recruit training from a civilian government police agency and who request early release in order to take up such employment'.".

About 20 major police departments will participate in the program. They will be allowed to send representatives to military bases to recruit men. The Washington Police Department (in a city which has the largest proportion of Afro-American residents in the country, over 70 per cent) will get the first pick, their recruiters will visit eight military installa-tions from the end of November to December 11.

For the enslaved GI who wants to escape the oppression of the U.S. Armed Forces, an early discharged is tempting. But clearly what the racist ruling class has in mind is to merely switch the uniform and change the "enemy" from an oppressed Vietnamese to an oppressed Afro-American peo-

McNamara's new order clearly illustrates the underlying class identity of the Vietnamese and Afnamese liberation fighters to be the perfect preparation for counterrevolution against the Black people at home.

RAP URGES Olympic Boycott

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

When SNCC proclaimed itself a Human Rights Organization this year it made public its recognition of two things: That racism colonialism are indivisible, and that they must be exposed and fought and destroyed on allfronts both here in the United States and abroad. It is in the spirit of re-sistence, long a tradition of black people in this ountry perpetrates sistence, long a tradition black people in this country, that we urge you in the name of our people to boy ott the 1968 Olympic Games.

The racism, imperialism and colonialism which this country perpetrates in territories within and outside its borders must be exposed by people like us, both exposed by people like us, the victims of it. As long as our brothers and sisters die on the streets at the hands of the racist keepers of a racist society; as long as thousands of us, both North and South, die yearly from starvation as long as our young men are marched to their deaths (to the tune of "Dixie") in a country whole real enemy, like ours is the United States; as long as our children are systematically and deliberately denied the right o an edu ation which reinforces our African heritage; as long as these atrocities occur, as black people living inside a monster annot aford the luxury of ignoring the means by which this country attempts to con eal its horrors.

One such means is the Olym ic Games, for it is to the black participants of the Olympics that the United States government coints when faced with the charge of racism within its own borders. They It shows that the U.S. ruling class point to you as living indications considers the slaughtering of Viet-that "things aren't that bad." But things are worse, much wors

It is a serious mistake to suppose that the Olympic Games are not political. Every game this country plays is a political attempt to maintain its capitalistic way of life and to orce others -- particularly its victims -- to accept its domination.

The United States has always used the Olympics as an important part of its vast political propaganda machine, seeking to bom-bard the international community with demonstrations o its "good will." It is imperative that we will." It is imperative that we halt the flow of lies this country perpetrates to blind and therefore further oppress others. It is imperative that we expose the hypocrisy of a country which projects a few individual blacks to justify its intended subjugation o the larger bla k community.

As members of a community, we all must find and use any weapon that will assist in the liberation of the community. One such weapon at your command is your refusal to participate in the 1968 Olympics, refusal which will -irmly place before the world the seriousness of our intent to resist and destroy the racism and colonialism inherent in the United States and its policies abroad.

We urge you to boycott the 1968 Olympics and add your voice to the demands of your people for human rights. Be assured that more honor accrues from consistent loyalty to one's people then from the acquisition of medals won at the expense of their struggle.

Mr. Goodman, with the reputa-tion for being the first lawyer to leave the U.S. to defend a soldier on trial in Vietnam, gave a bio-

graphical sketch of Ronney Ward, an a count of the trial history, and his own involvment in the case, to a group of about one hundred diners

mostly lawyers.
This country's contempt for it's black citizens came out in the things Mr. Goodman revealed with recognizable efforts to be impar-

Ronney Ward was being tried on two counts: (1) refusing order to return to combat duty (2) leaving, combat area without permission. The second of which is punishable

by death,
Mr. Goodman was unable to get
an acquital on the first count, but
because of non-political motives managed to keep the courtf rom finding Ronney Ward guilty on the second count.

In it's preliminaries, the nature of a court martial is better than the nation's civil courts. In a court martial, the defending lawyer is given free access to all the evidence and witnesses, before trial. Justice is apt to stop at this point. However, because it will depend on the personal disposition of the Base's Commanding General, who selects the court to try the case. This trickery is called 'command influence.

Mr. Goodman kept Ronney Ward from being shot by a firing squad and left the scene thinking that he had seen some fair amount of justice done. Then, the real concern of "the Great Society" for its black citizens came out in the trick bag the army put Ronney

The young black soldier was informed that if he would consent to serve an additional six months hitch in the army, the military court would suspend his convi-tion and release him with an honorable discharge. Soldier Ward, not knowing this was a feint, agreed to the move. When he was under command again, he was reordered to combat duty. And whn he refused again, he was re-charg-ed on the first count and the sus-

And while the insideous crew discussed above are fighting over money the honkie is committing some particularly outrageous atrocities against black women in this city. In recent weeks the INNER CITY VOICE has received numerous complaints from black mothers about abuse from their landlords. Recently landlords have arbitrarily raised rental rates, changed payment dates, and begun eviction proceedings. One woman who received a very small income had her rent raised five dollars a month while the landlord demanded an extra week's security deposit. She has lived in the building nearly two years. Another young mother of three children recently mover her furniture into an apartment, paid a security deposit and a month's rent at a total expense of \$160.00. Two days after she moved in her manager told her she has to move out next month. With three kids, it had already taken her three

months to find her present apartment.

These cases are merely typical of the kind of treatment black women ace at the hands of merciless greedy landlords who rent those rat and

roach infested firetraps.

The most recent outrage is the case of Mrs. Hunter and the notorious Goodman Brothers (see page one). As we go to press, the Goodman brothers threaten to lock out Mrs. Hunter even though evictions are illegal from Dec. 12th to Jan 2nd. The only reason for her eviction is that she had the nerve to seek aid after her children have been bitten by rats, injured in accidents, physically attacked in the building, and are still endangered because of the unsanitary conditions prevailing in the building.

Mrs. Hunter's daughter lost her eye when she tripped and fell running from a rat in their \$85.00 a month apartment. The child is recuperafrom an operation she had this past week. Yet the landlord has had the audacity to threaten to put her on the street, to take out her windows, and has already cut off her heat. She has been threatened by goons armed with shotguns and rifles. In the meantime, her daughter could lose her remaining eye if she isn't properly cared for. One can imagine the care a nine year old child can get in an unheated, rat infested apartment, Complicated by outrageous harrassment from the building management.

Apparently the only real protection she will get may have to be in the form of black revolutionaries actually placing guards around her

home. The only lasting solution to the problem will come when the Goodman Brothers and their fellow slumlords understand that the Black community is willing to take an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, when they understand that the bite of the rat is matched by the bite of the bullets and when they understand that their only chance of survival rests with their ability to get the hell out of the black community, and yet securely walk the streets of Detroit, no black man has no right to beat

his chest and proclaim his militancy.

The time has come, "Brothers," to put up or shut up.

Adam Clayton Powell, exiled in Bimini for almost a year, said he will not return to New York or run for reelection as long as the illegal jail sentence hangs over his head.

Powell indicated that he would like to run again, but felt that the venture would be nothing but a massive excercise in total futility.

Powell faces arrest in New York for supposedly slandering what he saw as a "bag woman": which is really sort of funny when you think of the white man's way of dealing with Black women.

Although Powell's 18th Congressional District re-elected him by an overwhelming majority at a special election las April, he was barred from Congress attera congressional committee using the double standard, recommended "censure".

Powell said that he still had the backing from his Harlem consti-"If I came back to Harlem and walked down Seventh Avenue on a Sunday afternoon, there would be pandemonium...pandemonium'
But, obviously there would not

be enough pandemonium to keep the Man from throwing him in jail. The courts have even threatened to arrest him on Sunday, an action which would make history, since in New York a man can be arrested on Sunday for criminal judgements, not civil ones.

Congressman Powell's case is a ivil one. The courts threat of arrest again demonstrates the double standard of justice that white,

ROTC Purged

BOSTON, Dec. 8
White students at Boston Univ-

ersity and black ones at Howard University, Washing on, D.C., have put an end to campus ROTC.

The B.U. faculty voted to abolish the campus military goup's academic status as a part of the university curri ulum yesterday. culminating a drive begun over a year ago by the B.U. News, which has since spread to some 35 other

Northeastern University, also in Boston, eliminated ROTC from the urriculum last spring.

At Howard, the university trustees abolished the school's compulsory ROTC program November 23 after a four-and-a-half hour sit-inin the office of university President James Nabrit.

As in Boston, the vote culminated a long drive, begun over two years ago, which has sin e included a campus referendum calling for an end to compulsory ROTC by a four to one margin; a faculty vote for abolition in the college of liberal arts; several campus petitions; rotest rallies;

and walk-outs. ROIC or Reserve Office ining Corps, was founded in 1916 to provide military training on campus. It still exists at 246 campus. It still exists at colleges, but is compulsory at only a handful. At most schools, it receives official academic credit while being entirely run by the military and beyond the control of both faculty and adminstration

BEREA, KY.

A group called the Black Students. of Berea Coolege have charged that the college is not living up to its long reputation as a champion of racial justice.

These students have organized to bring changes which they say will make the college's claims fit reality. They recently published a halfpage article in the college news-paper, THE PINNACLE, making

the following demands:

1. That Berea hire "several black instructors." The students say that college officials claim to be looking or "qualified" Ne-gros, but that this is a "biased criterion" since it apparently does apply to white instructors.

2. That the college should engage more black performers and entertainers, and enlist more Negro speakers for twice weekly chapel meetings. The students harge that there have been only two black speakers on the campus in three years and no performers.

3. That Berea put a Negro history course in the curriculum. "We also feel that the art and music departments should exhibit a more positive em hasis toward the artistic reations and musical expressions of Black Americans, the students said.

The protesters also declared "The black students do not intend to be showpie es of integration so that Berea may successfully mold poor whites into middle-class exploiters of the black American

'Whenever a white Berea student can say and believe that the momentum of the black movement is 'communist-ins sired', we are no longer content. We no longer intend to remain silent when racist dorm mothers interfere with interracial dating.

Some of the black students visited Willis D. Weatherford, Jr., President of the college at his home. They said he told them that college o ficials were working on at least two of their demands.

Soldiers Riot at Fort Hood

Washington, D. C. Nov. 29 (LNS)--Hundreds of soldiers w nt on an authority-defying ram age at Fort Hood, Texas last month on the eve of their being shipped to Vietnam.

Thousand of dollars in property was damaged and an undetermined number of troops end d up in the stockade A second lieutenant, part of a ontingent of military poli e who attempted to bring the rio "under control" was severely beaten by the troops. There was an unconfirmed report that he later

News of the racas was first released by The Rag of Austin and Houston, Tex. in its November 6 issue in a story written by Pvt Scotty Frame, who is stationed at Fort Hood.

Rag staffers said they on irmed the essential a ts in Private Frame's story in conversation with several other GI's. It was clear, they said, that so histicated politi al onsiderations were not the primary motivation of the soldiers.

It was equally lear, however, that a widespread feeling of desperation regarding the war was inolved. Certainly, the Fort Hood riot is part of a growing determination among U.S. soldiers not to kill or be killed in Vietnam.

Pentagon spokesman, questioned about the incident, at irst denied everything. New Black Federation Formed Here

Detroit's Negro leaders, both militant and moderate, are band-ing together to form a "popular front" type of organization to be known as "The Federation."

The goal of The Federation is to act as a clearing house among Blacks for programs and proposals to present a united front to the white community in demans for "self-determination for black peo-

The project has taken months to put together. The chairman of The Federation is the Rev. Albert Cleage, Jr., pastor of the Central United Church of Christ in the heart of Detroits riot area of last summer. He is also the city's best known Black militant leader.

Militants insisted that Mr. Cleage head the group, but it took some time before more moderate Negroes were willing to accept

The Federation is seeking sup-port from the powerful New Det-roit Committee, which includes some of the nation's leading businessmen. It wants the committee's support in getting \$187,000 to set up a staff, in the next six months and \$200,000 a year for two years. There is good chance that the New Detroit Committee will give its endorsement, which will virtually assure The Federation of getting the money from various funds.

"He is beginning to realize that rhetoric goes so far," said one the money from various funds.

The organizations's aims call for The Federation to be a non sectarian, non partisan, and non-profit federation devoted to improving the plitical, social and economic status of black people." It also addressed itself "eradi-It also addressed itself "eradi-cating racial prejudice; and to developing self-determination for developing self-determination for proposals for action by member

The new group has two vice chairmen. One Lorenzo Freeman is a militant who is a member of the New Detroit Committee and heads the West Central Organization, a militant inner city group. The other is Edgar Brazelton, former president o- the Booker T

Washington Businessmen's Asso-

Generally militant groups such as the Congress of Racial Equality have joined The Federation as organizations, while leaders of more moderate groups have join-ed as individuals. Robert Tindal, executive secretary of the local branch of the National Association of the Advancement of Colored People, is a Federation member, but his organization is not a member yet.

Part of the delay in joining is probably to test Mr. Cleage's lead-

ership.
"We are not willing to hand but we Cleage a blank check yet, but we have got to stop infighting and splintering. This is a well conceived program." Said one Negro

"It is still pretty fragile yet." said another.

There has been some feeling that Mr. Cleage is growing mor moderate in his approach.

The Federation's initial program would make it a forum for gathering, exchanging and dissemination information, dicussing priorities and promoting cooperation among its members.

He is expected to succeed. If those black leaders had resisted joining the Hudson Commission, the name could not be changed, unless it were changed to something like MALCOLM X MEMORIAL, or ROBESON ROAD, RAP BROWN BOULEVARD, or Le ROI JONES AVENUE; someone staunchly black of whom the statement of the st of whom every awakened black person should be proud. But, not, i- Crafty swings his weight and gets the name changed, it will be to please those outside the community, or by those inside the com-munity who can't think for themselves, and can't see for them-selves that what happened here in July was a victory for black people. If Crafty wants 12th Street and the black community changed, let him stand aside and let black people determine for themselves the what and the how. If he wants his police force to be loved, let us determine the when and the how.

Black Theatre

What is the role of the Black Theatre? Should it serve two or three different levels of communications in the community? Should it be a strictly commercial undertaking, prostituting it's culture to survive in competition with other theatres? Is it a place where black people come together to hear contemporary works normally considered outside the realm of theatre? Is it a pla e such as the Dexter Theatre where the Inner City Voice can freely present 'Rap' Brown without the distortions that the white medium af-ords.

These questions and others were the topics discussed by the informative and, at times, flamboyantly dramatic panel on Black Theatre at the recent Black Arts Convention. Participating on the panel were Woodie King, director, producer, and actor, currently from New York; Ronald Milner, author of the off-broadway production, "Whose Got His Own" and soonto-be-released film of the same name; and David Rambeau, actor, director and producer of the Concept East Theatre.

Mr. King found that Black Theatre could only survive commercially by pushing aside it's culture; art without commercial appeasement cannot survive in New York. Therefore, the Black artist was hung-up on trying to make a living in his own art media and failing to succeed because Whitey controlled the broadway circuit.

Newsweek Magazine, in a recent article on "The Negro in Show Business," quoted a similar statement by Belafonte, "...the inability

of the white community to permit that culture to thrive leads togreat frustration. All you get is: 'Gee, we have another Negro in another movie or another Negro has made another hit record'."

Mr. Milner took up this same trend and applied it to the Black dramatist. He felt that theatre ought to reflect the Black artist and the dramatist. He felt that and the black community "....not only what is --like the Now, but what ought to be ---- like How." It is the Black writer's responsibility to personify, clarify, and dramatize history in all art media not through the Othellos, and Hamlets, but through the Malcolms and the Garveys.

Mr. Milner noticed the current

trend of the poets toward a verbal rather than a written style. He felt that this verbal aspect was part and parcel of the Black man's own way of describing his own. .not the psychedelic, pop-art that Whitey uses to cop-out from content and concentrate on form (language for language's sake, color for color's sake, and nothing meaningful beyond this). Whitey has lost all form of sincere human communication and that is why his art has turned to absurdity. The 'true' art will have to be the new Black Art. He ended by offereing as the solution a "Black circuit". This would con-sist of Black technicians, Black actors, Black writers, and, most importantly, Black critics. A black critic could judge more accurately the commercial value of black art and Whitey would not be the critic on that which he could not, in essence understand.

BLACK POWER

By: Stokely Carmichael and Charles V. Hamilton

". For black Americans, to know it and tell it like it is and then to act on that knowledge should be neither embarrassing nor inconvenient nor confusing." This is a quotation from the pressee of the book "Black Power," and as might be expected, the authors tell it like it is. This book is for all black people serious about survival, and for those who wish to know it there is a question osurvival.

I had hesitated to begin reading it for 'ear that I would 'ind a weakly presented accumulation o stomach turning cliches, with meaningful thoughts scattered few and ar between. But this illusion began to go ast, rom the first sentence in the first chapter, where after questioning racism, they de ine it and divide it into individual racism and insti-

tutional racism.

A weakness in the treatise seemed to come after what I thought was a quite satisfactory analogy and definition of colonialism. They said: "Obviously, the analogy is not perfect." I wondered why the authors felt they had to apologize for this analogy and call it not perfect. The objective relationship seems acceptable enough because it is clear enough. 1968, our cash deficit will be aproximately \$922,100, even the securing of an additional \$300,00 would be insufficient with respect to the meeting of payrolls between the middle of February and the end of June.

It would appear, therefore, in view of the above, that all discernible doors are apparently closed in terms of securing authorization to borrow the needed \$900,000. However, despite this obvious possi-bility, it has been my purpose to seek some kind of dispensation in January from the State Legislature through the State Department of Education, which would, in fact, allow us to secure the needed authorization for borrowing \$900,000
The assumption here, of course,

is one wherein even if authorization were possible, there would still be the question of securing the funds from a local lending in-

The total projected deficit for the 1967-1968 s hool year is pin-pointed at \$1,047,000, ending June

30, 1967. A comprehensive examination of expenditure mandates through June 1968, which includes the reality that monies will have to be legally appropriated for purposes of repaying the \$500,000 loan which 1967, the total cash deficit of the District will be \$922,100 by June 30,1968. Furthermore, taking into account, the fact that, based on a projection of cash balances made on November 14, 1967, the cash on. hand after the first pay in Febamount to only approximately \$93,000, or an insufficient amount to meet the next payroll which a-mounts to at least \$140,000

This means, therefore, that the District will be unable to support payrolls beyond the pay date, February 2, 1968, unless we are able to secure two actions:

A. State authorization to borrow the needed \$900,000 to complete

the school year, and B. Obtaining a loan in said a-There is noguarantee attached to either of these variables. When we have reached the February 2, 1968 target date and no needed monies will have been se-

cured by that time, then the Sup-erintendent and the Board of Education have no choice but to declare the District in a state of economic insolvency---as based upon the historical amassing of the previously mentioned deficit. At this point it would appear that the state constitution mandate would come into the picture. That is, if the local school district is a quasi-municipal authority as established by the state for purposes of carrying on the educational function at the local level, them, when it becomes apparent that the local school district is unable to continue this role, the state will have to act. "It would be presumptuous of me to indicate any items of specificity with respect to precisely what kinds of projected action this might inwolve. It can prhaps be safely assumed, however, that in view of the present sociological realities of this society, the state is not going to allow a District concintaint of 5000 predestrict concintaint of 5000 predestrict. sisteing of 5200 predominantly children to be denied accessibility to education between February and June 1968.

When the funds, in effect, are completely expended, as far as the payrolls are concerned, then it will be necessary for the Superintendent, based upon the nonavailability of same, to discontinue the operation of the educational program or the Inkster Public Schools until such time as state assistance materializes. 
Since our "Declaration of Independence" on July 23, 1967, conversations in the black community are centered around facilitating the Black Revolution. No matmunity, on Woodward Avenue or Twelfth Street, Oakman Boulevard or Brush Street, the conversations are pretty much the same. The ghetto have the same eemy. They are victims of the same system. White racism. All of the brothers are in agreement that there is a problem, but not all are in agreement as to the extent of the roblem and the solution to the prothing that is necessary is that we begin to listen to each other, understand each other and ac ept the validity of an approach that may be different from our own. One of our major obstacles is, we don't want to listen to each other. The mili-

tant doesn't want to listen to the moderate and the modeeate wants nothing to do with the militant. But no single approach will beat the system. The white man would like for all of us to come up with a single program. Then he could send one "Tom" in to mess up anything that was planned. We need the brothers who can initiate and develop constructive programs, and we may also need the brothers who can plan and carry out succesully, programs of strategic and effective destruction, if necessary. We need negotiators and we need fighting men. We need 'statesmen' and 'ambassadors' to the white community and they need the kind of backing that will enable them to speak from a position of power rather than becoming merely the dupes of white men.

Whatever means we use in our struggle we must ask, will it be effective. Will it serve the needs of black people. Any strategy we use must be developed by and for black people. Any nation at war knows that you don't let the enemy plan your strategy for you. If the enemy plans your strategy for you, you don't have a strategy. You have a booky tree.

We must engage every black person in the revolution, and each black person must engage himself in the area where he can be most ening their unity and persevering effective. He must not criticize or under-cut his brother who may happen to be fighting on a different front. As long as his activity advances the revolution, he should be supported and encouraged. If it doesn't, then he should be straightened out. Even though we may be engaged in di ferent ac-tivities at different times, there are some things that we must do ogether, and that is: Think Black. Buy Black and Vote Black.

What types of weapons should be in the arsenals of the Black Revo-Guerrilla forces should rely heavily on simple and even home-made weapons. Much stress should be placed on obtaining highly portable weapons that are easily concealed. Revolutionary fighters must keep a sharp look out for hustling troops whose greatest preoccupation in life is to play the chicks and the night life; for a few bucks thay can become a great source for supplying much needed military gear. There is a great need for the black revolutionary to become proficient in ambushing and seizing arms and equipment from the enemy oppressor. This includes even the capture and use of tanks and armoured cars. Special effort should be made to locate and seize Minutemen and rightist fascist groups' arms caches. When

Revolutionaries must make a strong bid for dramatic victories that will inspire the people, encourage them to want to participate in a war of dignity, retribution and liberation. At the same time the urban guerrilla must strike

terror into the hearts of the enemy He must be well disciplined, o- high morale, devoid of ego and be able to work and think collectively. He must at all times project a double image. To the masses of the community he must project an image of a race conscious politically mature brother whose unshakable mission is to defend the human dignity o- our downtrodden masses. His image should be that of a liberator ra-His image ther than one of a thug rioter engaged in a orgy of pointless plunder. He should be a black patriot and savior who is convinced that is is more honorable to fight and die in battle against oppression and tyranny directed against the black people of the ghettos than to die in white men's wars of imperilism and the re-pression of -reedom loving colored peoples abroad He should equate his revolutionary actions, not to "looting" and "rioting", but to the spirit of the Boston Tea Party, the battle of Concord, Lexindton,

and Valley Forge. He must eel and understand the nobility of his historical role; a role that affords him the opportunity o- forging his own destiny and of bring new directions to the world.



But, if it is not done, Mr. Chairman, I assure you that it will not deter in the slightest the Freedom; Fight being waged in the United States, in the South and in the in the fields and in the ghettoes, for we know that it is only through the blood of the oppressed and the oppressors that people can win their freedom

We are absolutely confident that our efforts within the United States is going to hasten Victory in Southern Africa and their revolutionary armed struggle is going to hasten a better life for their African brothers and sisters enslaved from Africa, transplanted in an alien culture, forced to build the socalled great Western Civilization which oppressed mankind. We know that it is from the sweat and the riches of Africans, among other have derived their position.

Mr. Chairman, in speaking directly to the question of ways to deal with the problem politically, economically, militarily and diplomatically, we must express our full support of the resolutions introduced by the liberation organizations For they represent the thought of many of those who are directly suffering from the inhuman effects of racism, apartheid, and colonialism. We express our support of the Algerian resolution calling upon the Member States of the United Nations to give moral and financial support to liberation movements in Southern Africa and we support the resolution of the delegation from Iraq calling upon the Economic and Social Council to mount a massive educational campaign.

Mr. Chairman, in our last pre-sentation before this body we made certain recommendations which I would like to restate at this time.

1. That the ORGANIZATION OF AFRICAN UNITY increase its support for the liberation struggle in Southern Africa.

2. That the General Assembly find ways to implement its many resolutions, including the implementation of those resolutions by force. 3. That the General Assembly recognize that the Permanent Security Council itself is composed mainly of those who are the chief supporters and perpetrators of racism, colonialism and apar-theid, namely the United States, Great Britain and France. In this connection, it becomes mandatory for the General Assembly to rely on these so-called Great Powers to condemn themselves, but members of the General Assembly, espe ially the A ro-Asian delegates must find ways and means to curtail their influence and even limiting their veto

4. That the United States withdraw its investment and civilians from South Africa before the stage of revolutionary and struggle reaches the point of killing United States citizens and blowing up United States investments, after which we will see undoubtedly the sorry sight of the United States war machinery going to help the regime of Vorster or his kind in the name of protecting some blond or blue-eyed American who is in trouble through the efforts of the "uncivilized" African to free him-

selffrom his oppressors.

Mr. Chairman, we state here publicy that our organization and the Africans who are citizens of the United States have been remiss, we have not done our duty in mobilizing as effectively as we could have public support in the United States to oppose the policies of the United States in South

States. If this action is taken, it Africa. We accept and make this will be of significance to the world criticism of ourselves, but we ascommunity. plan to correct this. We intend to mobilize public opinion on the grass roots lever and to take other forms of action against the monster of colonialism, apartheid and racism.

In order to do this, we will need the full support of the United Nations and access to its many documents published and unpublished. We know that the United States government will try to block our efforts . It will try to stifle our attempt to link our struggle with that in Southern Africa. We are reminded that Malcolm killed when he attempted this. We know of the repressive laws against dissent in the United States.

Our brothers and sisters are dying in the streets of the United States as we utter these words They are engaged in rebellions and revolts against white people people, that those who live high have denied them their liberty and and mighty in Western capitals exploited our labor for centuries. Yet the United States representatives sit at this conference and talk about the winds of freedom blowing in the wind. There is indeed something blowing in the wind. It is blowing all over the world and that is a determination by the oppressed black, brown and colored people who form a world majority that the day of the white man exploiting all of us is over.

In Southern Africa, the cry has been raised by all voices: Freedom or Death. In the United States we too have decided that it was better to wage a fierce, unrelenting struggle than to live as neoslaves in the twentieth century.

Mr. Chairman, we call once more upon all the delegates here assembled to notify their Governments the cry of the Afro-Americans is that there is an indivisible nature to the struggle against racism, apartheid and those of us in the United States are indeed victimes of the same colonialism that established apartheid.

Unless one is certain of one's own immortality, the death of another human being is a solemn occasion. However, it is not an occasion to hide or distort the truth in obsequience to such solemnity.

Francis Cardinal Spellman was ignorant man. A man utterly blind to change. A man who perverted the Christianity he profes-

sed to follow.

Cardinal Spellman played a leading role in spreading the anti-Communist hysteria that swept the United States following World War II, which helped solidify the Cold War and which led to the witch hunts and McCarthyism.

He was implacably resistant to the winds of revolution sweeping the Catholic Church; in this, a veritable religious anachronism.

But perhaps Cardinal Spellman will be best (?) remembered for his remarks about Vietnam:

"This war in Vietnam is I believe a war for civilization. . . and (American servicemen) "are here not only as soldiers of the Army of the United States, but also as soldiers of Christ."
