PHILADELPHIA, Pa.—The shoe workers of the Philadelphia area fought a hard and a long fight, but they won a complete victory in the strike against the open shop start-up of the shoe makers upon a combination of forces.

The Philadelphia Shoe Co. has notified the workers that it will immediately re-opens a Sunday strike. Recognition of the union working card and the pay-off, instead of the former side agreement are the outstanding terms being offered the union.

Only One Lot.
The Shoe Co. demands that the shoe workers must have a union working card.

The shoe workers have made an announcement of victory over the Philadelphia Shoe Co. was created a year ago as a great center of cheap and anti-union work.
